POSTAGE RATES GOING UP

Effective January 22, 2012, US Postal Rates will increase as follows:

- ⤴ First Class letters (up to 1 ounce): 1-cent increase to 45 cents.
- ⤴ Additional ounces: unchanged at 20 cents each.
- ⤴ Postcards: 3 cent increase to 32 cents.
- ⤴ Up to one ounce letters to Canada and Mexico: 5 cent increase to 85 cents.
- ⤴ Letters to other international destinations: 7 cent increase to \$1.05.
